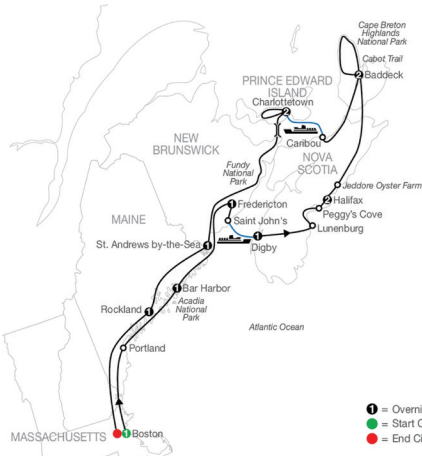

Daily Itinerary

Day 1	Winnipeg – Boston Welcome to “Beantown.”
Day 2	Portland, Bar Harbor Head north to Portland. Stroll down the cobblestone streets of Old Port Exchange, lined with boutiques, cafes and galleries. Continue to Bar Harbor, Maine’s oldest summer resort. Dinner is a traditional lobster bake. B/D
Day 3	Acadia National Park–Fredericton Visit the picturesque Acadia National Park. Travel to Fredericton, New Brunswick, and explore the culturally rich community by dining in the Historic Garrison District or by strolling along the St. John River. B
Day 4	Saint John's–Digby Travel to Saint John and board a ferry to Digby, a popular resort. Stay at the elegant Digby Pines Resort and partake in a private demonstration to hear about the Digby scallop, while savouring dinner at the resort. B
Day 5	Lunenburg–Halifax Travel to Lunenburg, a major fishing port and a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Visit the Fisheries Museum of the Atlantic. Continue to Halifax and enjoy the rest of the day at your leisure. B
Day 6	Peggy’s Cove Savour a traditional Nova Scotian breakfast and explore the famous lighthouse and its picturesque setting. Visit historic Citadel Hill and see Fairview Cemetery, the final resting place for some who perished on the Titanic voyage. Then, visit the Maritime Museum of the Atlantic. B
Day 7	Jeddore Oyster Ponds–Baddeck Explore Jeddore Oyster Ponds for the Fisherman’s Life Museum Via Canso Causeway, before crossing over to Cape Breton Island. B/D
Day 8	Travel along the Cabot Trail , while savoring vistas of the rocky shoreline. Enjoy a picnic lunch. See Cape Breton Highlands National Park, a landscape that resembles Scottish coastal regions. Return to Baddeck for a tasting of Nova Scotian wines. B/L
Day 9	Baddeck–Caribou–Charlottetown Visit the Alexander Graham Bell Museum tracing the achievements of the great inventor. Head back to the peninsula, where a ferry whisks you to Prince Edward Island. Explore Charlottetown and get acquainted with this colonial town. B
Day 10	Charlottetown Morning at leisure. Enjoy an afternoon tour of the island. Visit Green Gables Heritage Place, the setting for the novel <i>Anne of Green Gables</i> . B/D
Day 11	Fundy National Park–St. Andrews By-The-Sea Return to New Brunswick. Visit Hopewell Rocks with a Naturalist Guide. Enjoy lunch at a third-generation ranch. Continue on a scenic drive to St. Andrews By-the-Sea. Stay at the historic Algonquin Resort. B/L
Day 12	St. Andrews By-The-Sea–Rockland Orientation tour of unique St. Andrews. Journey through forests and across sheltered coves to quiet fishing villages along the way to Rockland. This evening, enjoy a special farewell dinner. B
Day 13	Free day in Boston. B
Day 14	Return to Winnipeg.
